5.) Articles

In light of the COVID crisis, we would like to draw your attention to ratings and the risk of insolvency. Werner Gleißner's and Ottmar Schneck's article "The Blind Spot of Business Administration: Insolvency Risk and Rating are Systematically Ignored" discusses the fundamental importance of ratings and the risk of insolvency for controllers and managers. In practice there are rating and financing restrictions that lead to insolvency and the probability of such insolvency is essential e.g. for business valuation or financing decisions. Until now, both aspects have received too little attention, both in theory and in practice. (members only)
